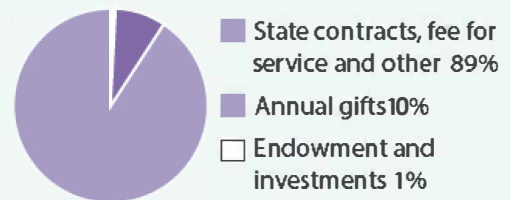
Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services' mission is to provide Christ-centered care and support to children and families in need.

Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS) opened its doors in 1914 when four Presbyterian ministers in Farmington, Missouri saw a need for homes for orphans in the Lead Belt of Missouri. Over the past century, the agency has expanded to meet the needs of today's children and families. We serve children who have suffered from neglect, abuse and/or abandonment. We also serve children whose families are experiencing other types of crises, such as the death of a parent, divorce, illness, homelessness or parental drug and/or alcohol abuse.



Our five programs offer a continuum of care:

- **Therapeutic Mentoring**
- **Family Solutions for Kids**
- **Foster Care Case Management**
- **Residential Treatment**
- **Transitional Living**

In 2016 our ministry:

- Enabled 645 children to develop meaningful friendships with caring mentors
- Helped 1146 children and their families overcome obstacles and stay together
- Instilled hope in 569 foster children and supported their foster parents
- Provided residential treatment for 103 abused and neglected children
- Empowered 28 children as they transitioned from foster care to independent living

Altogether our programs helped 1,846 children and 5,096 family members in need.
